SUBJECT:	Ongoing projects in the Village

Issue

The issue is providing the Trustees with an update on current and proposed projects in the Village.

Discussion

The following projects are currently underway, or work is being undertaken to move a possible project forward.

1. **4 Pearl Street**. The steel has started to be erected on site. The completion date for the project is still late summer 2016.

2. **The Crescent Connector Road Project**. We are hoping to enter the ROW phase soon, which can be the most demanding and lengthy portion of the project. It is hoped to begin construction of the new rail crossing in the autumn of this year, with the new road portions currently being planned for construction in 2016.

3. **The Pearl Street Missing Link Project**. This project has moved along well to date. We have contacted residents to discuss easements, which are mostly construction easements that expire when work is completed.

4. **The Multiuse Path Project**. We are currently renegotiating the lease for the Path with NECR and VTrans. Charles Hunter and Mike Olmstead from NECR and Ande DeForge from VTrans have been very helpful in this process. The lease is currently being reviewed by a federal employee to see if the changes bring the lease into line with federal ROW requirements.

5. Main Street Sidewalk Extension Study. This Study is moving through smoothly. We have had several meetings to date and it is hoped a report will be ready for Trustee review before winter.
6. Train Station Study. We are currently working on the bones of a report. This should be ready before winter for Trustee review.

7. Update of the Land Development Code. We have reached Chapter 6 of the Code for the first review. Once the Code updates are completed we will review the changes once more before presenting the document to the Trustees for approval.

8. Renewal of the Village Center District Designation. Work has not started on this yet. The application is due September of this year.

9. Application for Neighborhood Designation. Work has not started on this yet. It is a revolving application process.

Cost

Although the Missing Link and Connector Road projects are CIRC funded, we have been told by a staff member of VTrans that the standard Village gas light style street lights do not meet the VTrans Amenity Policy standards and thus will not be eligible for funding under this program. This is a deviation from the Village's understanding when the funding was announced. We are working to have this stance reviewed by VTrans.

There are costs (twenty percent match of approved funds), associated with the Multiuse Path and the Main Street Study.

Recommendation

<u>lssue</u>

The issue is whether or not the Trustees will adopt the Resolution for Current Expense Borrowing and sign the Current Expense Note and the Resolution for the renewal of the Fire Truck Note.

Discussion

The Trustees approved a one year note in FYE13 in the amount of \$250,000 to help pay for the fire ladder truck. The plan was to pay \$50,000 principal each year for five years and to renew the note annually. The Warrant approved at the July 14th meeting included a check for \$52,305.89 to pay \$50,000 principal and \$2,305.89 of interest which is our third payment. The Merchants Bank has agreed to issue another one year note for \$100,000. The cost of the fire truck has been paid in full in the amount of \$829,736 (the Village saved \$30,000 by prepaying for the truck). The funds to purchase the truck came from:

Village Rolling Stock\$529,736 (includes note for \$250,000)Town of Essex contribution\$300,000

<u>Cost</u>

The interest on the \$100,000 note is 1.6%, which will result in an interest charge of approximately \$1,600.

Recommendation

The entire amount borrowed by the issuance of the Note, together with all of such, if any, amounts previously raised or borrowed for the same purpose, does not exceed the total costs of such current expenses less all other funds available for the purpose, and all of the proceeds of the Note have been or are expected to be needed and expended for such current expenses within six (6) months from the date of the first borrowing for these expenses.

5. The Note is being issued to a refund note previously issued for the same purpose described in paragraph (3).

6. Any real and personal property, acquisition of which has been financed by the Note has not been and is not expected during the life of the Note to be sold or otherwise disposed of for consideration.

7. It is expected that any earnings or net profit derived from investment or deposit of the proceeds of the Note, including transferred proceeds, any accrued interest received upon sale of the Note and any premium received on the delivery thereof, will be expended for current expense payment purposes within the period stated in paragraph (4) above to the extent such funds are not commingled for accounting purposes in the general funds of the Issuer with tax and other substantial operating revenues.

8. The Issuer has not created and does not expect to create or establish any debt service fund, bond payment reserve, sinking fund, or other similar fund pledged to the payment of the Note or from which it is expected that payment of the Note would be made.

9. To the best of our knowledge, information and belief, the above expectations are reasonable.

10. The Issuer has not been notified of any action by the Commissioner of Internal Revenue to disqualify it as an issuer whose arbitrage certificates may be relied upon.

11. No part of the proceeds derived from the issuance and sale of the Note nor the expenditures financed by the proceeds of the Note shall be:

a. Used, loaned or otherwise made available to any person or other entity, other than the Issuer or a governmental body, so as to cause the Note to be classified as a private activity bond or [a] *an* arbitrage bond, as those terms are defined under the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, and the Regulations promulgated thereunder by the U. S. Treasury (collectively, the "Code").

b. Used directly or indirectly in a trade or business by any person other than the Issuer or another municipal entity;

c. Loaned to any person directly or indirectly other than the Issuer;

d. The subject of any contract, lease or agreement of any sort having a term of one year or more and calling for the payment by the Issuer of consideration other than a flat fee;

e. Expended to finance the construction, alteration or renovation of any improvement the use, occupancy, availability or beneficial enjoyment of which shall be restricted among public users thereof or for which preferential, different or unique fees, rates, assessments or charges shall be levied;

f. Invested in such a manner or for such a period or at a yield to result in the rebate of interest earnings thereon to the United States under any public law now or hereafter in effect;

12. The Issuer shall furnish to the United States, or any agency, department or instrumentality thereof, in a timely fashion, such information as may be required by law with respect to all evidences or debt now or hereafter issued by the Issuer.

13. Neither the proceeds of the Note, nor any earnings derived from the investment thereof, shall be expended for the purpose of paying any costs associated with the issuance of the Note.

14. The Note will not be refunded or otherwise paid, defeased or secured by the proceeds of any form of debt issued by the Issuer, if the manner of such payment, refunding or security, results in the Note being classified as a "private activity bond" or an "arbitrage bond" within the meaning of Sections 103, 141 and 148 of the Code.

15. The proceeds of the Note shall not be invested for a period or at a yield so as to render the interest payable on the Note includable in the gross income of the holder thereof.

16. The proceeds of the Note will not be used in a manner that will cause the Note to be "arbitrage bonds" or "private activity bonds" within the meaning of Sections 103(c), 141 and 148 of the Code.

17. The aggregate principal amount of the Note is not greater than the maximum anticipated cumulative cash flow deficit which has been computed in accordance with the Regulations promulgated under Section 148 of the Code.

18. The Note is declared to be a "qualified" obligation under Section 265(b) of the Code.

This Certificate is executed and is being delivered pursuant to Section 1.148(b)(2)(i) of the Regulations promulgated under Section 148 of the Code.

Issue

The issue is whether or not the Trustees will set the Village of Essex Junction FYE16 tax rate at \$0.2366.

Discussion

The Village voted to raise \$2,564,285 in property taxes for FYE 2016 at the Annual meeting on April 1, 2015. The Village also voted on April 8, 2014 to bond for capital improvements. The payment on the bond for FYE 2016 is \$223,426 which is included in the amount to be raised of \$2,564,285.

The Grand List value received from the Town assessor on 7/14/15 was \$10,850,118. The Grand List increased by 1.85% from 2014 to 2015. The Grand List value has been adjusted for the tax stabilization agreements for the Whitcomb Farm property at 315 South Street and the property at 8 Railroad Avenue resulting in an adjusted Grand List value of \$10,841,408. In order to raise the taxes necessary for the General Fund budget including bond payment, the tax rate needs to be set at \$0.2366 per \$100 of assessed value. This is a **decrease** of \$0.464 or 16% in the tax rate. Please see the attached rate calculation for a more detailed comparison of this year's rate to last year's rate. This tax rate is slightly less than the rate (\$0.2387) projected when the budget was approved.

Cost

The cost to a tax payer with a \$270,000 value home will be \$639 which is a **decrease** of \$125 from FYE15 taxes. The decrease is due to the Town of Essex assuming the costs for the Street Budget and Stormwater expenses.

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Trustees set the FYE16 tax rate at \$0.2366 per \$100 of assessed value.

<u>Issue</u>

The issue is whether the Trustees should appoint members to the working group for Thoughtful Growth In Action.

Discussion

TGIA is a community-wide project that will study the best planning and zoning governance structure for the future of Essex, including the Village of Essex Junction. A key part of the project will be a committed working group, which will consider various options for planning governance. The working group will ultimately make recommendations to the Trustees and the Town of Essex Selectboard for how Essex can best pursue thoughtful growth across the entire community.

The TGIA steering committee (Max Levy, George Tyler, Pat Scheidel, Doug Fisher, and me) solicited applications for the working group by sending direct invitations to numerous people and boards, and by making broader invitations on Front Porch Forum. Nearly 30 people responded. The 28 candidates represent elected and appointed officials, municipal staff, residents, and local developers.

The project consultants have repeatedly assured the steering committee that they can successfully facilitate the work of a large group. With that in mind, the steering committee is recommending that all applicants for the working group be appointed. The full list of the recommended working group is attached.

All TGIA working group meetings will be open to the public, so residents not serving on the working group can continue to follow and participate in the process.

The Essex Selectboard received a similar memorandum at their meeting on July 20, 2015, and approved the appointments to the TGIA working group.

5. WORK SESSION: Update of Land Development Code

Robin Pierce noted plats are recorded in the town. The revision to the Land Development Code erroneously said plats are recorded in the village. The LDC has been corrected.

The Planning Commission continued review of Chapter 5 and Chapter 6 of the LDC. The following was noted:

• Suggestion was made to include a flowchart and timeline of the steps of an application review and the documents/forms required at each step for incorporation in Chapter 5. Staff will draft a flowchart for conceptual, preliminary, and final plan review, a timeline showing what materials need to be submitted and when in order to be warned for a hearing, and a checklist of what is needed for a complete application and to move forward through the review process.

- Section 502 appears to discuss uses versus procedures. Clarification is needed. A flowchart could show what is triggered at each step.
- A definition of "Planned Residential Development" or "PRD" is needed.
- Re: Section 509.B it was confirmed the Board of Trustees grant curb cuts and can supersede the Planning Commission and Zoning Board.
- Re: Section 510 (issuance of a certificate of occupancy) it was confirmed there is not a separate form to be completed for a certificate of occupancy. The CO is part of the application.
- In Section 510.B language should be included to say a change of use requires a CO.
- In Section 511.C language is needed to explain the advantages of a PUD and why a development is considered a PUD. A list of possible amenities with a PRD could also be included.
- In Sections 511.6.a & f it was noted approval from the Planning Commission does not guarantee other approvals that may be required (i.e. zoning or Act 250 or others).
- Sections 512 & 513 regarding storm water will be reviewed by Jim Jutras.
- The heading of Section 515 needs to be reworked ("...one acre or more or more than one acre..." is awkward).
- In Section 515.A, first sentence change "and" to "and/or".
- Section 516 regarding development within 200' of a waterway will be reviewed by Jim Jutras.
- In Section 516.A add language to say check the appropriate federal and state agencies.
- In Section 516.H comment was made the zoning permit should actually be called a development permit.
- Chapter 6 (zoning district regulations) change "PUD" to "PRD".
- In Section 601.G.1.2.b change to read "Design compatibility with adjoining, developed properties." Change to read the same in each subsequent occurrence of the sentence in the document.
- In Section 604 (village center) language needs to be added saying the village center is a designated regional growth center. A balance must be found with being a growth center and the historic character of the area. One approach could be to allow development along the arterial routes within the designated village center. Current language saying "reinforces existing architectural design and layout" could hamstring the village to development that is not wanted.
- In Section 604.E, first sentence change "overall village" to "regional economy" and clarify that the design review section applies to a development application.
- Globally in the document ensure formatting, style, and spacing are consistent and any typographical errors are corrected.

Dear Jon,

I want to once again thank you for attending our 5/26/15 meeting to discuss possible CCTA route changes that could impact riders in our community. I also want to relay our board's continuing and unanimous support for the public transportation alternative CCTA provides.

As I understand your email of July 1, 2015 to Patty Benoit in the Essex Junction office, CCTA buses on the Burlington-Essex Junction (#2) route will continue traversing the So. Summit/West/South Street portion of the circuit, with the sception of curtailing that portion of the circuit on Sundays. I believe you're aware that a Village homeowner who esides on South Street has respectfully but persistently questioned the inclusion of the So. Summit/West/South Street link in that circuit. He believes: 1) the ridership on that portion of the route is extremely low; 2) routine passage of CCTA buses in front of his house throughout the day has damaged his foundation and perhaps other components of his property; 3) the weight of the buses (>16,000 lbs.) should exclude them from using those Village streets.

The Village staff has noted that the relevant Essex Junction Municipal Code (Section 852) specifically refers to "motor trucks." Buses are not mentioned and therefore should be considered excluded from the weight limit ordinance. The Essex Police have informed us that under present circumstances they would not enforce the weight ordinance on CCTA buses, and that if we desired them to enforce the ordinance we should first have a dialogue with CCTA. Our board is somewhat hesitant and would like to have more information before bringing this matter to a conclusion.

I understand that the routing and scheduling of buses is determined by many factors, the discussion of which likely exceeds the bounds of routine correspondence. But could you possibly summarize the reasoning and/or necessity for using the So. Summit-South St link? Is the turning radius of the bus a factor? Are there other factors? Are alternative routes available? We note that we have had correspondence from several people on that route urging its continuation. Lastly, if the Trustees decided that CCTA should apply for a fleet permit that allows them to travel on weight-restricted streets, would you be willing to apply for such a permit?

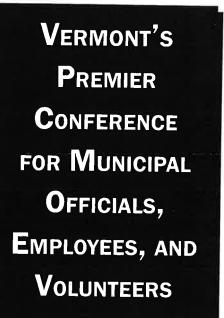

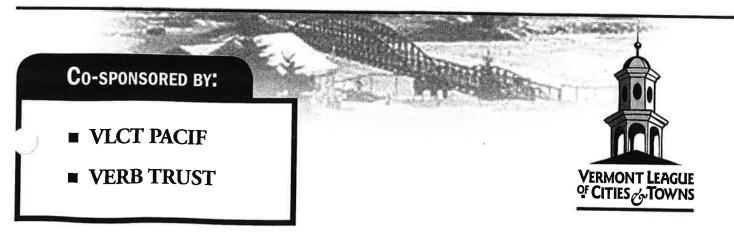

On Thursday, July 16, 2015, representatives from the CCRPC, VTRANS and Essex, Essex Junction, Colchester and Williston met for an update on the status of the Circumferential Highway Alternative Projects. The attached chart was provided.

For those unfamiliar with the VTRANS process, PE is the preliminary engineering design phase, followed by the final design and right of way acquisition phase (PE/ROW) followed by the actual construction phase (CON). Phases I and II have been guaranteed funding and do not have to compete with other regional or state projects. Their completion is a function of how fast the projects can be moved through the process, given the availability or non-availability of VTRANS engineers and consultants and the impact of right of way delays.

A subsequent e-mail was circulated regarding the Williston-Essex STPG SGNL(46) project.

On the reverse side of the document, the Phase III projects are listed. The projects in green and yellow are actually supported in the State's capital program. This means that funds will be scheduled for these identified projects. Relative to specific Essex Phase III projects:

- VTRANS will revisit the Town in 2016 to discuss the signals versus a roundabout at VT117/North Williston Road. This project will not go forward until this issue is resolved.
- 2) We have asked that other funding such as safety funds be looked at for potential funding of the VT117/ North Williston Road Hazard Mitigation Project. This is a small dollar project that is needed now and the Town "may" be willing to contribute some funds to move this faster.
- 3) The Susie Wilson Corridor project is a huge and very expensive undertaking. Discussions need to take place early to settle issues left unresolved in scoping with the possibility of splitting this project into smaller and more manageable pieces. For example, this might involve doing the VT15/Susie Wilson Road intersection through Pinecrest Drive before tackling the rest of the roadway where there are significant ROW issues.

Bruce and Dennis,

Ken Robie asked me to brief you guys on the status of our Williston-Essex STPG SGNL(46) project.

The project proposes to install Adaptive Traffic Signal Control (ATSC) at 19 intersections along three separate corridors between the two towns. The three corridors are VT Route 2A in Williston from I-89 Exit 12 to Mountain View Dr./Industrial Ave., US Route 2 in Williston from Brownell Roads to Talcott Road, and along VT Route 15 in Essex from the VT Route 289 EB Ramps to the VT Route 128 intersection.

We are just now starting the development of the project. There is a lot of work to be done before we can implement ATSC at this many intersections. Without complicating the procedure too much for you, I can tell you that the majority of this project is studying what the impacts of ATSC will have on these intersections. We will do this through the FHWA's Systems Engineering process for ITS systems. This required process will be composed of a pre- versus post- installation analysis using traffic modeling and simulation software. If our analysis is successful, FHWA will then sign off on it and the recommendation for ATSC hardware and software at these locations. At that point, we can pull together bid documents for the project.

In terms of scheduling, we anticipate that the Systems Engineering process would take up to a full year, starting this summer. So, it is likely we could have deployment of the ATSC in 2017, as the plans for a project like this are fairly straightforward and currently don't anticipate impacts to Right-of-Ways. In terms of permitting, Environmental resources aren't expected to be impacted and we envision very minor impacts to Utilities.

Attached you will find a brief, high-level scope and estimate that the RPC presented at the last TAC meeting in April. Since that time, the estimate has increased as new information came to light regarding the amount of vehicle detection that would be needed at each intersection. I would suspect, at this very early stage of project development, that the project will be north of \$2 million.

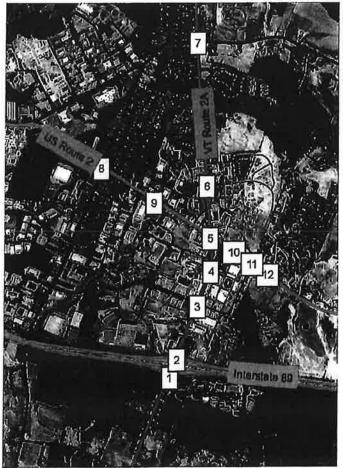

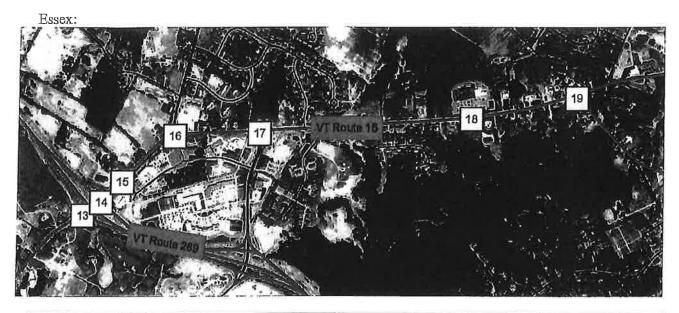
SCOPE

The subject project seeks to implement adaptive traffic signal control (ATSC) at 19 signalized intersections along three heavily travelled corridors in the towns of Williston and Essex. There will be 12 installations of ATSC in Williston and 7 in Essex. The Williston system will include coordinated signals along two arterials, US Route 2 (Williston Road) and VT Route 2A (St. George Road/Essex Road). The Essex system will include coordinated signals along VT Route 15. Below are maps showing both systems. A legend corresponding to the intersection numbers follows.

ESTIMATE

A detailed conceptual estimate was compiled in November, 2014. Items accounted for in the estimate included network-wide equipment and function (i.e. communications drops, networking hardware and ATSC server/maintenance/monitoring), intersection-specific hardware (i.e. ATSC hardware, vehicle detection, controller upgrades) and project-level costs (i.e. labor, materials and mark-up).



With ATSC systems in the United States all using different hardware and software, most of which is proprietary, estimating the generic cost for ATSC for this project was difficult. Essentially, the estimate had to be broken out on a network-level and an intersection-level basis. Then, each had to be sub-divided into proprietary and non-proprietary items.

In the end, the conceptual estimate for the STPG SGNL(46) project will be in \$1,300,000 to \$1,800,000 range.

1. <u>CALL TO ORDER and PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE</u>

Village President, George Tyler, called the meeting to order at 5:30 PM and led the assemblage in the Pledge of Allegiance.

2. <u>AGENDA ADDITIONS/CHANGES</u>

Additions:

- Updated list of appointees under "Old Business".
- MOU on Shared Bank Account under "Old Business".
- CVE Request for Neil Young Concert Hours of Operation under "New Business".
- Bid Award for Maple Street Culvert under "New Business".
- Warrants for Approval under "Consent Agenda"

MOTION by Dan Kerin, SECOND by Lori Houghton, to accept the agenda as amended. VOTING: unanimous (5-0); motion carried.

3. <u>GUESTS, PRESENTATIONS, PUBLIC HEARINGS</u>

1. Meeting with Members of Boards/Commissions/Committees re: Reappointments The Trustees met informally with individuals currently serving on village boards/commissions/committees and those seeking appointment to discuss activities and achievements. There was also discussion of consolidated planning and zoning governance with the town and the need to respect and preserve the unique peculiarities of each community, and to keep volunteers serving in both the village and town engaged.

2. Comments from Public on Items Not on Agenda

Speeding on Village Streets

George Tyler mentioned comments were posted on Front Porch Forum regarding cars speeding on South Street and West Street. Glenn and Lori McPeters, 6 South Street, stated cars exceeding the speed limit on the street is a problem. There are children and lots of traffic. The homeowner of 36 South Street stated traffic volume on the residential street is very high because the road is used as a cut-through to avoid Five Corners. The cars are exceeding the speed limit and even beep their horn and do rude gestures if they are behind someone doing the speed limit. There are also commercial vehicles including 18 wheelers using the street. Raj Chawla, Warner Avenue, said there is a lot of traffic on Warner Avenue, too, with close calls every day. Lori Houghton said traffic on School Street is also heavy and going fast. Drivers are not stopping at the stop sign and some are on their cellphones.

Pat Scheidel will ask Police Chief LaRose to attend the next Trustees meeting to discuss ideas on controlling speed in neighborhoods. The police have issued 48 warnings and seven tickets in the last two months on West Street and South Street. A monitoring device that flashes the speed of the car has been set up as well. Dan Kerin stated based on his experience speeding is a perpetual issue and Essex Police is working hard to address the matter.

3. Vietnam Veterans Memorial Traveling Wall

Vince Benevento showed pictures from 2001 of the traveling memorial wall and explained the planned ceremony to be held October 1-4, 2015 including the reading of the names on the wall. Donations are requested to reach the goal of \$10,000 (\$5,300 has been collected as of July 1st). Contact Mr. Benevento to volunteer to read names.

4. Award Presentation for Bicycle Friendly Community Designation

Rick Hamlin gave a brief history of the Bike/Walk Advisory Committee (eight members) and the progress made on the list of projects identified by the committee. The committee completed the onerous application to The League of American Bicyclists for designation as a bike friendly community and received the Bronze Level designation. Only two other communities in the State of Vermont have achieved the national designation (Montpelier, Burlington). Next step is to work to achieve the Silver Level designation and continue to grow bike facilities in the community.

Andrew Brown suggested announcing the award at the village annual block party. Lori Houghton suggested also making the announcement at the Farmers Market.

4. OLD BUSINESS

1. Request from Bike/Walk Advisory Committee for Signs

MOTION by Lori Houghton, SECOND by Elaine Sopchak, to approve the request from the Bike/Walk Advisory Committee to purchase four street signs that indicate Essex Junction is a bicycle friendly community. VOTING: unanimous (5-0); motion carried.

2. Appointments to Boards/Committees/Commissions

MOTION by Andrew Brown, SECOND by Dan Kerin, to make the following appointments:

- Aaron Martin Zoning Board of Adjustment through 6/30/17
- James Moody Zoning Board of Adjustment through 6/30/18
- Carmelle Terborgh Library Board of Trustees through 4/12/16
- Gabriel Epstein Bike/Walk Advisory Committee through 6/30/18

VOTING: unanimous (5-0); motion carried.

Pat Scheidel observed with the appointments all vacancies on village boards are filled.

3. CCTA Buses on South Street

George Tyler reported per village ordinance the vehicle weight limit on residential streets is 16,000 pounds. The CCTA bus using South Street weighs 40,000 pounds. The bus does not have a waiver to use the street, but the village has allowed the bus route to continue based on the long standing position in support of public transportation in the village. Essex Police said they do not stop the bus on South Street, but do stop large trucks. CCTA can request a fleet permit to use the street or request a waiver of the ordinance.

Andrew Brown stated using public transportation decreases the carbon footprint in the village. More information is needed on the use of the street including how and why 16,000 pounds is the weight threshold, the actual bus ridership on the route, and how many complaints from residents have been received.

Following further discussion there was agreement a waiver of the ordinance is needed if the weight limit is exceeded or the ordinance needs to be changed. More information is needed from CCTA on whether South Street must be part of the route. George Tyler pointed out the ordinance was put in place to stop tractor trailer trucks from using residential streets, not to stop passenger buses passing through a residential area. Essex Police said they will not ticket the bus and advised the village to contact CCTA about changing the bus route. Robin Pierce, Development Director, noted CCTA is looking at potentially staying on Route 15 and not using South Street. Once the analysis is done CCTA will report to the village.

COMMENTS

Glenn McPeters, 6 South Street, made the following comments:

- No one is advocating stopping public transportation in the village.
- The request is for the CCTA bus using South Street to stay on Route 15 which is the route traveled on the return trip to Burlington.
- Per traffic counts for the last five years the bus from Pearl Street to South Summit Street to South Street to Park Street has an average of three riders per day.
- Over \$10,000 in repairs have been done to the house at 6 South Street to address damage caused by the passing bus shaking the house and there is more damage to be addressed.
- Residents need to be given consideration.
- The vehicle weight limit on the road is 16,000 pounds. The weight of the bus is 40,000 pounds.
- If the Trustees mandate the bus to stop the police will initiate enforcement.
- The letter against stopping the bus route is from a resident living only 100 yards from the next bus stop. The letter from CCTA about concern for impact on service to IBM does not mention that only four or five buses go to IBM and the rest go through Five Corners. The CCTA letter also mentions impact on the schedule if South Street is not used and the bus must go through Five Corners which indicates CCTA is using South Street as a cut-through to avoid Five Corners. There was earlier discussion and concern about vehicles cutting through neighborhoods to avoid Five Corners.

- There have been three votes by past Boards of Trustees to stop the bus from using South Street, but CCTA has simply continued using the street which brings into question who is in control of the village streets.
- Tractor trailer trucks do not go down the street every 10 minutes like the bus which is empty on most passes.

Lori McPeters, 6 South Street, expressed concern about the adverse impact of the bus causing damage to the house on her husband's health.

Pat Scheidel asked Mr. McPeters if he contacted CCTA directly. Mr. McPeters said he lodged an official complaint with CCTA via mail and they acknowledged receipt of the letter, but to date no response has been received.

George Tyler clarified the police said the Trustees need to contact CCTA about their decision on the bus route and if operation continues against the Trustees decision then enforcement will be done. There are bus stops on South Street so the bus is not just passing through. If there is school consolidation then there will likely be school buses on South Street.

There was agreement by the Board of Trustees that a letter should be sent to CCTA informing them of the decision facing the village regarding South Street and the need to hear CCTA's side of the situation. A copy of the letter will be sent to Glenn McPeters.

4. Appointment to Ad Hoc Governance Committee

MOTION by Lori Houghton, SECOND by Dan Kerin, to appoint Elaine Sopchak as the Village Trustee to serve on the Ad Hoc Governance Committee. VOTING: unanimous (5-0); motion carried.

5. Amendment to FY2016 General Fund and Water Fund Capital Plans

Lauren Morrisseau reviewed changes to the projects in the Capital Plan including adding the Hillcrest sidewalk design work in FY2017 and construction in FY2018, adding the lighting for the firehouse in FY2016, doing the scoping study for the Main Street sidewalk (is in process now), and adding the Multi-Use Path West Street to Pearl Street design work in FY2016 with construction in FY2018 assuming the grant is received for the project. The Railroad Avenue water line is pushed out to FY2017. The Maple Street culvert project now includes water line work and that portion of the project is considered a water project and included in the Water Capital Fund for FY2016.

MOTION by Dan Kerin, SECOND by Andrew Brown, to approve the reconfigured FY2016 Capital Plan for a budgeted amount of \$6,393,419 and the reconfigured FY2016 Water Fund Capital Plan for a budgeted amount of \$294,707. VOTING: unanimous (5-0); motion carried.

6. Approve Cash Sharing Agreement with Town of Essex

Lauren Morrisseau stated the Village Treasurer is the primary signatory on the shared account and the agreement has been revised to reflect this.

MOTION by George Tyler, SECOND by Lori Houghton, to approve the amended Cash Sharing Agreement with the Town of Essex. VOTING: unanimous (5-0); motion carried.

The Trustees signed the agreement.

5. <u>NEW BUSINESS</u>

1. Request from CVE for Neil Young Concert

Robin Pierce clarified the waiver in place is for sound, not duration. Neil Young's manager said the concert done by the performer will extend beyond the 11 PM deadline. CVE is contacting the neighbors to the fairgrounds about the matter.

Elaine Sopchak commented that the date of the concert may not be a school night, but people still have to go to work in the morning.
