#### Memorandum

**Re:** Approve the use of Economic Development Funds for Parking

**Date:** May 24, 2019

#### Issue

The issue is whether the Trustees will approve the use of \$100,000 in Economic Development Funds for parking.

#### Discussion

On May 14, 2019 the Trustees instructed Village Staff and the Village attorney to develop an Agreement for 33 public parking spaces in a to—be-constructed parking garage in the Village Center. The Agreement, for 10 purchased public vehicle parking spaces and 23 donated public parking spaces, would be brought back to the Trustees for approval and signature by the Village Manager. The Village will pay \$100,000 for the 10 spaces, and provide a letter on Village letterhead to the property owner stating that the 23 donated public parking spaces have a value of \$460,000, and are for the exclusive use by the Village of Essex Junction for public parking.

The intention is to use the Economic Development Fund to finance the \$100,000 payment. The Economic Development Fund was established at annual meeting 2016 where the voters approved adding one cent to the tax rate to establish a fund for Village capital improvement projects designated by Village Trustees. The tax rate will be reconsidered by the voters at the annual meeting 2021. The current balance in the Fund is \$324,404.


This is also subject to the project being approved by the planning commission.

#### Cost

\$100,000

#### Recommendation

It is recommended that the Trustees approve the use of \$100,000 from the Economic Development Fund.



RAMP UP PARKING GARAGE 21 SPACES


### 9 & 11 PARK STREET - LOWER LEVEL PARKING PLAN

services. The intention is to identify and eliminate duplication of services by the village and town and increase efficiencies. The governing bodies are informed of the dollar value of savings and move toward a more equitable tax structure. George Tyler pointed out the town outside the village pays a highway tax which has been decreased and the savings moved into the general fund to the benefit of all the citizens of the town and village.

CALL THE QUESTION by Diane Fuchs, SECOND by Chuck Barry. VOTING on call the question: majority of ayes; motion carried. Discussion ceased.

VOTING ON ARTICLE 2: majority of ayes; motion carried. Article 2 is adopted.

ARTICLE 3: Shall the voters approve adding one (1) cent to the tax rate to establish a fund for village capital improvement projects designated by the Village Trustees?

MOTION by Tim Jerman, SECOND by Mary Jo Engel, to approve Article 3 as read. <u>DISCUSSION</u>: Village President George Tyler explained one cent on the tax rate will raise \$109,000 each year. The money will be used to make public improvements in the village center such as pocket parks or benches when the opportunity arises. Any expenditure would be discussed at a Trustees meeting and public comment would be gathered.

#### **PUBLIC COMMENTS**

 George Dunbar, III, expressed concern about the proposed fund, noting the Land Development Code already empowers the village to require developers to do improvements and if the fund is used to purchase real estate the discussion of such purchase could be in Executive Session so there would be no public input.

AMENDMENT by George Dunbar, III, SECOND by Alison Wermer, to add the following wording to Article 3 to read: "Shall the voters approve adding one (1) cent to the tax rate to establish a fund for village capital improvement projects designated by the Village Trustees with a cap of \$250,000 and expenditures from which are at the request of voters at the annual meeting or a special meeting called for that purpose."

DISCUSSION OF AMENDMENT: The following comments were made:

- Tim Jerman, Sycamore Lane, spoke against the amendment because the Trustees have the best interest of the village downtown in mind and need to have the ability to act when opportunity comes up.
- Carl Wermer, Lincoln Street, mentioned the cost and burden to call a special meeting. Trustee Sopchak said the cost is thousands of dollars to warn and organize a special meeting.
- Trustee Sopchak stated one of the many purposes of the fund is to have the nimbleness and ability to help local businesses

in the village with a revolving loan or a small grant for façade improvements or other beautification activities, for example. A public hearing would be held on how to use the funds. A cap on the fund would limit opportunity for the village to be part of a large grant that required a local match.

- Greg Morgan, Grove Street, compared the concept of the proposed one cent fund to the rolling stock fund that avoids having to bond for purchases and gives the village some flexibility. Mr. Morgan noted the Economic Development Committee in the town often cannot act because the town does not have the resources. Mr. Morgan supported the concept of the fund provided there is public process.
- Darryl Stultz, Seneca Ave., spoke in support of having a cap on the fund and asked how long the taxpayers would pay into the fund if there is not a cap. George Tyler said without a cap the fund would continue to accrue or could be spent each year. The Trustees would review the fund each year.
- A gentleman in the audience asked about discussion in Executive Session per state statute. Elaine Sopchak explained state law is strict on what can be discussed in Executive Session.

CALL THE QUESTION by Chuck Barry, SECOND by Dorothy Bergendahl. VOTING on call the question: unanimous; motion carried. Debate ceased. VOTING ON AMENDMENT (cap of \$250,000): majority of nays; motion does not carry. The amendment fails.

<u>CONTINUED DISCUSSION (on original wording of Article 3)</u>: The following comments were made:

- Molly Dillon, Jackson Street, asked how other places, such as St. Albans, supported the fund. Elaine Sopchak said St. Albans established a special tax district (TIF) and worked with the state and developers.
- Alison Wermer, Lincoln Street, suggested putting a sunset on the fund of five years and discussing continuation at that time.

AMENDMENT by Alison Wermer, SECOND by Darryl Stultz, to add wording to Article 3 to read: "Shall the voters approve adding one (1) cent to the tax rate to establish a fund for village capital improvement projects designated by the Village Trustees and such tax rate to be reconsidered by the voters at the annual meeting in 2021?"

DISCUSSION OF AMENDMENT: The following comments were made:

 Brad Luck, Main Street, asked if the article will be before the voters each year. Moderator Eustis said as currently worded the article will not be before the voters again.

- George Dunbar, III, spoke of following the same process for the fund that is followed with the Rolling Stock Fund and the Capital Improvement Fund in that the Trustees discuss the project and transfer money into the fund. Village President Tyler pointed out the Trustees borrowed the one cent fund concept from the town which has two cents on the tax rate for capital projects. The Trustees felt one cent was reasonable and not overly burden the taxpayers. George Dunbar stressed the need to set priorities for use of the money. There are already various funds established.
- Jeffrey Thompson, Rosewood Lane, asked the impact of one cent on the tax rate. George Tyler said the impact is \$28 per household. One cent raises \$109,000.
- Aaron Smith, Main Street, asked who will own and maintain items such as pocket parks. George Tyler said that will be determined by the circumstance. Pocket parks may be the responsibility of the village. The village can require developers to do a lot, but there is a limit. The fund can provide an incentive.

CALL THE QUESTION by Tim Jerman, SECOND by Chuck Barry. VOTING on call the question: unanimous; motion carried. Debate ceased.

VOTING ON AMENDMENT (five year sunset/review): majority of ayes; motion carried. The amendment is adopted.

CONTINUED DISCUSSION on Article 3 as amended: There were no further comments.

VOTING ON ARTICLE 3 as amended (five year sunset/review): unanimous; motion carried. Article 3 as amended is adopted.

ARTICLE 4: Shall the voters approve holding the 2017 Annual Meeting on Wednesday, April 5, 2017 to act upon any articles not involving voting by Australian ballot and to reconvene on Tuesday, April 11, 2017 to vote for the village officers and transact any business involving voting by Australian ballot? MOTION by Chuck Barry, SECOND by Tim Jerman, to approve Article 4 as read. DISCUSSION: None.

VOTING ON ARTICLE 4: unanimous; motion carried. Article 4 is adopted.

ARTICLE 5: To transact any other business that may lawfully come before the meeting.

RE: Development of a new policy & permit process for Special Events

#### **ISSUE:**

Each year we are receiving more and more special events request. Our municipal departments are finding it harder to process, track and coordinate these request that are often placing an increased burden on municipal departments and resources. The police department is seeing increased complaints from citizen about these special events and how they impact the community. I would like recommend the development of a new policy & procedure for how special events are reviewed, funded, approved and publicized.

#### **DISCUSSION:**

I envision a policy that will regulate the request, funding, approval and notification of special events. At this time I believe that "Special Events" could include things like parades, street closures, street events (5k runs, block parties), fireworks, music events (amplified) and other identified events that either affect municipal resources or that may impact the community by traffic, noise, public safety, crime, etc. The policy should at least include; what events are allowed, an application review process that include things like department review & paperwork, an approval process (department, trustees), fees, permit conditions (sound monitoring, traffic control) and possibly an appeal process

**COSTS:** None - staff project

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

It is recommended that the Unified Manager set up a working committee to develop a Special Events permitting policy and process for review and consideration of the Village Trustees and public feedback.

#### 1. CALL TO ORDER and PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Andrew Brown called the meeting to order at 6:32 PM and led the assemblage in the Pledge of Allegiance.

#### 2. AGENDA ADDITIONS/ CHANGES

Mr. Tyler added item 8a to the agenda, for the Trustees to enter executive session to discuss a real estate matter, and item 5c, to act on the real estate matter if needed.

#### 3. APPROVE AGENDA

GEORGE TYLER made a motion, and DAN KERIN seconded, that the Trustees approve the agenda as described. VOTING: unanimous (5-0); motion carried.

#### 4. PUBLIC TO BE HEARD

a. Comments from public on items not on the agenda.

There were no comments from the public.

#### 5. BUSINESS ITEMS

a. Discuss whether to consider initiating proceedings and a petition pursuant to 19 V.S.A Chapter 7 to lay out a road to be named Railroad Street and to be located beginning at a point on Park Street approximately 875 feet south of the 5 Corners intersection, then extending north along Park Street to the New England Central Railroad (NECR) Burlington branch; along the east side of NECR's Burlington branch and crossing NECR's main line; continuing north across Maple Street; and then along the existing alignment of Railroad Street to the intersection of Main Street.

Mr. Teich introduced the issue of initiating proceedings and a petition pursuant to 19 V.S.A Chapter 7 as a step in the process of constructing part of the Crescent Connector in the Village of Essex Junction. To complete the Crescent Connector project, the Village needs to obtain land within the scope of the project. It has become clear that condemnation proceedings will be necessary to acquire some of the land for the project. He explained that the first step on initiating these proceedings, and a petition pursuant to 19 V.S.A Chapter 7, is for the Essex Junction Board of Trustees to discuss the issue and vote on whether to proceed.

Mr. Brown and Mr. Tyler stressed the importance of moving forward with the Crescent Connector, which is a longstanding strategy initiated as part of the Circ. Alternative study many years ago. The project was identified as a state priority, designed to alleviate traffic congestion and increase safety for pedestrians and bicyclists. They discussed the deep financial challenges that would lie ahead if they do not move forward with the project, pointing out that all phases are being reimbursed by the state of Vermont with the assumption that it will be completed.

Mr. Chawla and Ms. Thibeault asked about the condemnation proceedings and petition timeframe as well as the process that led up to this. Mr. Pierce explained that the first part of this project was to secure easements from abutting property owners and this included an appraisal process. During this phase, 15 property owners signed off on easements but two industrial properties rejected them. He said that the rejected easements would affect a very small portion of the landowners' properties, using land that is already being used for vehicle parking. The easements would make an access driveway into a road. The rejection of these easements initiated the process of acting against these properties as identified in 19 V.S.A Chapter 7. Once the property for the Crescent Connector project is secured, the first phase of construction, installing railroad crossings, is scheduled for this construction season, and the rest of the Railroad Street project is scheduled for next year.

GEORGE TYLER made a motion, and AMBER THIBEAULT seconded, that the Trustees initiate proceedings and a petition pursuant to 19 V.S.A Chapter 7 to lay out a road to be named Railroad Street and to be located beginning at a point on Park Street approximately 875 feet south of the 5 Corners intersection, then extending north along Park Street to the New England Central Railroad (NECR) Burlington branch; along the east side of NECR's Burlington branch and crossing NECR's main line; continuing north across Maple Street; and then along the existing alignment of Railroad Street to the intersection of Main Street. VOTING: unanimous (5-0); motion carried.

Mr. Teich assured the Trustees, with the passing of this motion, that staff will follow all state statutes in this process.

#### a. Discuss Planning Commission vacancies

Mr. Teich explained that the Planning Commission's design code states there should be 7 members on the Commission, but currently there are 5. He asked if the Trustees would like the Planning Commission to continue to be comprised of 7 or approve a change so the full commission would be 5. Mr. Teich pointed out that the two vacancies have been posted on Front Porch Forum and the Village website with no interest shown.

Mr. Kerin said that when he was on the Planning Commission it was designed to be 5 members, which worked well for efficiency and finding a quorum. Ms. Thibeault said that the number of people on the commission had been 6, while she served, with one vacancy for some time. She found this configuration to work but suggested keeping the number at 7 for a few more months to see if any people show interest.

Mr. Chawla and Mr. Kerin discussed how experience, diversity and people's backgrounds play on the Planning Commission. Mr. Kerin and Mr. Tyler talked about the challenges faced by the Commission when community members get confused by the code and attend meetings to try to make changes on a project, when decisions have already been made and cannot be reversed. Mr. Teich and Mr. Tyler considered the role of advisory committees to engage people from the Town Outside the Village, but clarified that the Planning Commission is written into the Village Charter.

Mr. Teich will run the postings for the Planning Commission for another 60 days then revisit the issue with the Trustees. Each of the Village Trustees agreed to reach out directly to at least one individual who may be a good fit for the role.

**b.** Take action on the real estate matter, if needed as per executive session item 8a. After the executive session, the Trustees reconvened to take action on a real estate matter.

GEORGE TYLER moved, and DAN KERIN seconded, that the Trustees instruct Village Staff and the Village attorney to develop an Agreement for 33 public parking spaces, to be constructed in a parking garage in the Village Center, for Trustee approval and signature by the Village Manager for the purchase of 10 public vehicle parking spaces for which the Village will pay \$100,000 plus a letter on Village letterhead to the property owner stating that the donated 23 public parking spaces that have a value of \$460,000 for the exclusive use by the Village of Essex Junction for public parking.

The Trustees discussed he source of funds for this arrangement, with the intention of using the economic development fund and having it be warned at a future meeting.

Mr. Teich commended the individuals that are on the list for jobs well done. He pointed out that each are being re-appointed.

Jeffrey Kershner, the president of Hamilton Consulting thanked the Trustees for reappointing Hamlin Consulting Engineers as the Village's Engineering Consultant for another year and talked about his dedication to working for Essex, his hometown.

#### 7. **READING FILE**

- a. Board Member Comments
  - Mr. Tyler updated the Trustees on the Governance Committee's plan to contract a person/firm to conduct a series of focus groups with community members on consolidation. This strategy is based on feedback that the original bid's project was too complicated.
  - Mr. Brown shared some results of a survey conducted by the Burlington Chamber of Commerce's Young Professionals group, showing that Essex did not make the top ten places to live for 25-30 year olds. However, he explained, actual population growth records of people in this age bracket are higher in Essex than other towns in the area. Mr. Teich and Mr. Chawla discussed the importance of the district telling a better story about Essex and highlight what it offers.
  - Mr. Teich shared some Unified Manager notes:
    - Blodgett Oven Company will bring another division to Essex, which will add 20-90 new jobs. Their facility will be built on Saxon Hill. Essex was chosen based on a competitive selection process, from a pool of regions in other parts of the country.
    - The #4 Green Mountain Transit (GMT) bus route will continue, despite concerns that it would change, and that the #2 bus has GMT's highest ridership.
    - The generous donation of 165 acres of land from the Unsworth family to Essex, which abuts Indian Brook and is significant to the conservation of animals, waterways and plants, was recognized on the house floor in Montpelier on May 14<sup>th</sup>, 2019 with a resolution read by Representative Marybeth Redmond.

ANDREW BROWN moved, and GEORGE TYLER seconded, to enter into executive session to discuss a real estate matter in accordance with 1 V.S.A.
