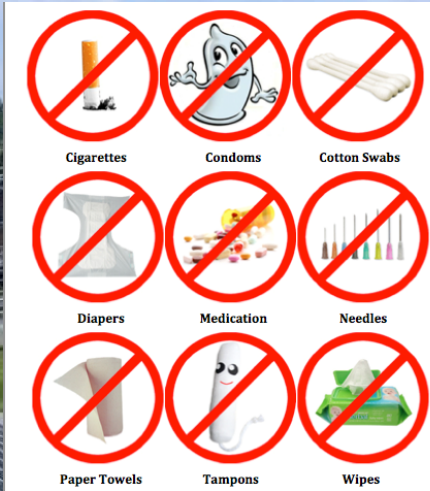
Anything other than human waste and toilet paper clogs the sewage system and costs taxpayers money to be removed
